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FROM THE ADG COUNCIL CHAIR MARK WORTHINGTON

Welcome to the 26th Annual Art Directors Guild Awards banquet —it's wonderful to be back together again in person for this special evening! Though still grappling with the pandemic, we are now

seeing hopeful signs that we are reaching a place of increasing normality: tonight, is one of those signs.

Our membership has endured great hardship in the last two years with the effective shutdown of our industry early in the pandemic. Fortunately, we have seen that industry rebound in spectacular fashion to levels of production which now exceed those prior to the advent of COVID-19. Director, writer and producer Jane Campion, whose works includes some of the most original and beautifully crafted films of the last 30 years—the startling, savage and visually ravishing *The Power of the Dog* being the most recent example—will receive the Cinematic Imagery Award.

Five legendary members of this Guild will receive our Lifetime Achievement Award this evening. Graphic Artists and general polymaths, Michael and Denise Okuda, whose pioneering work on the user interface and graphic design for the *Star Trek* franchise have set the standard by which all such design is now judged; Set Designer Ann Harris, whose drawings span the breadth of our industry from preeminent television such as *Ally McBeal* and *Weeds* to the iconic films *Point Break, The Fugitive* and *The Last Samurai*; Illustrator Donna Cline (with whom I worked on the film *Tombstone*), a brilliant storyboard artist on a range of films from *Total Recall* to *Congo*, also brought her considerable skills as a trained medical illustrator to projects such as *House* and *Bones*; and Production Designer Ida Random—a pioneering figure in the industry, who has collaborated with some of the most iconic directors of our time on a breathtaking range of films: the seminal Western *Silverado*, post-apocalyptic *The Postman*, action thriller *Fast & Furious* and of course, *Rain Man*—for which she received an Oscar nomination.

As we come together again to celebrate our industry and our crafts, I wish you and your family good health and good fortunes in the coming year.

Each of our four crafts, Illustration & Matte Artists; Set Design & Model Makers; Scenic, Title & Graphic Artists; and Art Direction & Production Design, have selected longtime, esteemed members to receive our Lifetime Achievement Awards. Those recipients are Production Designer Ida Random (AD), Graphic Designers Michael and Denise Okuda (STG), Set Designer/Art Director Ann Harris (SDMM) and Concept Illustrator/Storyboard Artist Donna Cline (IMA), who have each earned the respect of their peers and so we celebrate their legacies.

We are also thrilled to induct the Oscar-nominated Production Designer Polly Platt and the Academy Award-winning Production Designer William A. Horning into the ADG Hall of Fame. Polly, the trailblazing and multi-talented force of nature, whose career spanned 30 years, is known for iconic shows such as *The Last Picture Show, Terms of Endearment* and *A Star Is Born*, to name just three. William, who became MGM's Supervising Art Director after the retirement of Cedric Gibbons, was nominated for an Oscar multiple times (North by Northwest, for example) and won, posthumously, twice for *Gigi* and *Ben-Hur*.

We in turn are honored to present our Cinematic Imagery Award to Academy Award- and Palm D'Or-winning writer/director Jane Campion (*The Piano* and *The Power of the Dog*), the first woman to be nominated twice for Best Picture.

We also bestow our William Cameron Menzies Award to the Academy Award-nominated director Denis Villeneuve (*Dune* and *Arrival*), who is well known for incorporating the power of production design in his cinematic expression.

This year marks the first time that we have given commercials and music videos their own separate categories, and all I can say is, it's about time!!

Let us all raise a glass and make a toast to the fortune we have all been bestowed with to work creatively in this fabulous industry and to be blessed to be members of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees, the organization which has tirelessly fought and negotiated for our rights and dignity as artists, our wages and benefits, and our terms and conditions of employment.


Set Designer and Art Director

Ann Harris worked as a Set Designer and Art Director for 35 years on more than 60 movie and television projects, including Edward Scissorhands, The Last Samurai and Life as a House. Retiring in 2012.

She began her career as a Set Designer working at Universal Studios at a time when the studio had its own Art Department, an era long forgotten in this time of freelance work. She had little trouble finding work, with jobs at Warner Bros., Fox, MGM and

CBS, and again with Universal, on Matlock. When Stephen Cannell opened his own company, she was hired as a Set Designer and Art Director, working constantly.

Harris has worked with some of the industry's top directors—Ridley Scott (Someone to Watch Over Me), Tim Burton (Edward Scissorhands), Kathryn Bigelow (Point Break) and Steven Spielberg (Schindler's List). Her other notable feature credits include The Last Samurai

(set design), Life as a House (set design), The General's Daughter (Art Director), The Wedding Singer (set design), Casino (set design), Dante's Peak (Asst. Art Director), Thirteen Days (Art Director), Sister Act (set design), Father of the Bride (Asst. Art Director), and more.

In addition to motion pictures, Harris is credited for many TV series, including Weeds (set design), Criminal Minds (set design), Heroes (set design), Six Feet Under (set design), Ally McBeal (set design), The Rockford Files (Art Director), and Remington Steele (set design), among many others.

Over her decades of productions, Harris collaborated with many iconic Production Designers, including Dante Ferretti, Larry Paull, Dennis Washington, Sandy Veneziano, Gene Callahan, Bill Elliott, John Jefferies, Jim Bissell and Bo Welch.

Ann received a BFA from USC and initially worked as an interior designer in Hawaii and swam competitively with U.S. Masters Swimming, winning several medals. She has always maintained an interest in the Manhattan Project, having been born just two hours after that first A-bomb test in New Mexico.

An avid philanthropist, Ann has been actively involved with Amnesty International, and numerous political campaigns, including Jerry Brown's campaign for President in 1982. Ann served as Local 847 President, Vice President and Treasurer.

Ann lives in Sherman Oaks with her husband Otis Hayes and enjoys spending time with her son Mathew Schick.


Production Designer

Born in the small town of Johnstone, Scotland, Ida Random always knew she wanted to be an artist, and this would be her destiny in Hollywood whether she realized it or not. Her father was an engineer and his career led them to living in Liberia, Zaire, Brussels; her family eventually settled in Vancouver, Canada, where she developed her skills as a painter in art school in the mid-1960s. She married her high school sweetheart, a popular young actor who had landed a role on a TV show and they were off to sunny Los Angeles.

As she described: "After the wild days of the late sixties and being a flower child, the bottom fell out and I had to go to work." Now a mother of two, she managed to land a job at *The Hollywood Reporter* in the Art Department and it was here that she started fulfilling her dreams of production design. With the support of Tichi Wilkerson, Ida was able to take on small Art Department jobs,

including a TV movie for Beau Bridges. Soon thereafter, a friend introduced her to one of her biggest influences, Production Designer Richard Sylbert. It was with his guidance that she continued her education and learned how to draft. Later, he introduced her to the great British Production Designer, Terry Marsh, who gave her, her first job as a Set Designer on the film *The Frisco Kid*. Seemingly guided by a lucky star, Terry then introduced her to Oscar-winning Production Designer Stephen Grimes and she was his Assistant Art Director on the films *Urban Cowboy* and *On Golden Pond*.

Her big break came when Richard Sylbert was offered to do *The Big Chill* but wasn't available, so he recommended her. She met with Lawrence Kasdan and he took a chance, hiring her on her first Production Designer job. No one could have imagined the success of this film, and it became the perfect launching pad for her career. She





would team up with Kasdan on two more films starring Kevin Costner, *Silverado* and *Wyatt Earp*, both with ambitious builds where entire towns were erected in the middle of the high desert of New Mexico. The town of Silverado became known as the Cook Movie Ranch set, and from 1985 through the 2000s, the town they built was rented out to dozens of other film productions, too many to list here.

Her career spanned 42 years and more than 30 films, highlighted by an Academy Award nomination for *Rain Man* in 1988. Some of the other projects she has worked on also include highly acclaimed films like *Throw Momma from the Train, The War of the Roses, Hoffa, Along Came a Spider, The Fast and the Furious: Tokyo Drift,* and the remake of the *Roots* TV miniseries, just to name a few. In additional to Lawrence Kasdan,

Ida had the honor to work with directors Kevin Costner, Brian DePalma, Danny DeVito, Tony Scott, and Barry Levinson.

Ida is a trailblazer in a male-dominated industry and her drive to succeed helped pave the way for many aspiring women designers to follow. Who could have known that, as a young woman, her training as a painter and master of color and light would serve her so well in the high-pressured world of filmmaking. Early on in her career, she viewed the process of filmmaking as "making a painting" and this gave her a unique vision that so many learned to trust and admire.

Ida Random now splits her time between Santa Fe, NM, and Los Angeles, CA. She had two children, Oscar Mazzola and the late Harlie Random.

The Art Directors Guild is thrilled to fete acclaimed director Jane Campion among our celebrated filmmakers this year. Long a filmmaker's filmmaker, Campion's exacting use of design and style to fully realize her storytelling have made a significant contribution to the visual language of film, while authoring and fostering the genesis of environments that extend the audience

experience far beyond the page. Her ability to tell stories and capture moments that marry the interior voice with the expansive visual voice of carefully crafted frames has led to the creation of numerous impactful images that will continue to influence narrative storytellers and touch the hearts and minds of viewers for years to come.

New Zealand-born Academy Award winner Jane Campion has established herself as one of the world's most powerful storytellers. Her productions consistently reflect the highest quality of production design. Best known for her debut feature *The Piano*, Campion was the first female director to win the Palme D'Or and one of only seven women ever to be nominated for the Best Director Oscar. The film also received more than 30 international awards, along with nine Academy Award nominations and three wins, including for Best Screenplay. Most recently, Campion was awarded the Silver Lion for directing

at the Venice International Film Festival for her film *The Power of the Dog.*

Campion's other films include Sweetie, which premiered at Cannes; An Angel at My Table, which won seven prizes at the Venice Film Festival, including the Silver Lion; The Portrait of a Lady, which was nominated for two Academy Awards; Holy Smoke, which was nominated for the Golden Lion and won the Elvira Notari Prize at Venice; In the Cut, which premiered at Toronto; and Bright Star, which was nominated for the Golden Palm in Cannes.

In television, Jane created, co-wrote, codirected and executive-produced the twoseason miniseries *Top of the Lake*. The series ultimately received eight Emmy Award nominations, including Outstanding Lead Actress for Elisabeth Moss, who also won a Golden Globe for her performance.

Jane was President of the International Jury of the 54th Mostra Internazionale d'Arte Cinematografica (Venice Film Festival). In 1997, she was awarded the Carosse D'or Prize by Societe de Realisateurs de Film in recognition of "innovative qualities, courage and independent mindedness" presented on the opening of Directors' Fortnight at the Cannes Film Festival in 2013. She was the President of the Jury at the 67th Festival de Cannes and was awarded the Legion of Honour from the French Cultural Minister in 2014. In 2016, Jane was appointed A Dame Companion of New Zealand Order of Merit and in 2019, she joined the World Cinema Dramatic Jury at Sundance Film Festival.



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
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

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

WILLIAM A. HORNING

1904-1959

William Allen Horning was born in Missouri in 1904 and grew up on a ranch in Sanger, California, in the beautiful Central Valley of California. He graduated from UC Berkeley School of Architecture in 1925. After graduation, Horning moved to Santa Barbara and began his architectural career under the mentorship of Lutah Maria Riggs, the first woman in California to be named a fellow of the American Institute of Architects.

As a result of the economic depression, construction in Santa Barbara came to a halt, so Bill moved to Los Angeles to work at MGM Studios. He started at MGM as a draftsman and became an assistant to the studio's Supervising Art Director Cedric Gibbons. Together with Gibbons, he received his first Academy

Award nomination for Best Art Direction for Conquest (1937). Two years later, he received another nomination for The Wizard of Oz (1939), but the Oscar was awarded to Gone with the Wind. It would be 12 years before his next nomination, for Quo Vadis (1951).

Following Gibbons' retirement in 1956, he became MGM Studio's Supervising Art Director. In this role, he received Academy Award nominations for Les Girls and Raintree County in 1957. The week before he died, he received another nomination for Best Art Direction for Gigi (1958) and at the 31st Academy Awards ceremony, he received a posthumous Academy Award. The following year, he received two additional posthumous Oscar nominations









(bringing his nominations' total to eight), for Alfred Hitchcock's North by Northwest and the epic film Ben-Hur. At the 32nd Academy Awards ceremony, he won his second posthumous Academy Award for Best Art Direction for Ben-Hur.

Bill met the "love of his life" while attending UC Berkeley, Esther Montgomery Horning. He and Esther raised three sons: William Jr., Thomas, and Robert. All three boys loved building and designing things and grew up to become engineers of some sort. Bill, Esther, and their youngest son Thomas lived and traveled throughout Italy for several years during the filming of Ben-Hur, an experience that the family thoroughly embraced and enjoyed. He passed away in 1959 from cancer at the young age of 54. At the time of his passing, he was survived by Esther, his three sons, and many grandchildren.



HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

POLLY PLATT

1939-2011

Polly Platt was born on January 29, 1939, in Fort Sheridan, Illinois, USA as Mary Marr Platt. Her father John Cheney Platt was an Army colonel and her mother Vivian Marr worked in advertising. At age 6, she moved to Germany with her mother and brother Jack, where her father was working in the Judge Advocate General's Corps of the United States Army at the post-World War Il Dachau Nazi war-crimes trials.



Platt studied scenic art at Carnegie-Mellon and was the first woman to join the Art Directors Guild as a Production Designer. As an Oscar-nominated Production Designer, screenwriter, producer and executive who put her stamp on some of the greatest and most loved films of the 1970s and '80s, she was one of the industry's most versatile and distinguished creative talents. She designed costumes and sets for such films as The Last Picture Show (1971), Paper Moon (1972), What's Up Doc? (1972), The Bad News Bears (1976), A Star Is Born (1976), and Terms of Endearment (1983). She was also a Production Designer on Bud Yorkin's The Thief Who Came to Dinner (1973), Garry Marshall's directorial debut, Young Doctors in Love (1982), The Man with Two Brains (1983), and The Witches of Eastwick (1987). She is also credited with discovering and launching the acting careers of Tatum O'Neal & Brooke Shields, as well as bringing cartoonist Matt Groening (The Simpsons) to Gracie Films.

As a writer, Platt co-conceived the story for the thriller Targets (1968), wrote the story and screenplay and served as associate producer for Louis Malle's Pretty Baby (1978), and adapted William Inge's novel for the film Good Luck, Miss Wyckoff (1979). She also wrote the teleplay for the short Lieberman in Love (1995), directed by Christine Lahti and adapted the novel The Map of the World (1999), starring Sigourney Weaver and Julianne Moore.

She was executive vice president of James L. Brooks' production company, Gracie





Films, from 1985 to 1995. After teaming with Brooks, she brought the novel War of the Roses (1989) to Gracie Films, and served as the film's producer. She also produced Broadcast News (1987), Say Anything (1989), I'll Do Anything (1994) and Bottle Rocket (1996), Wes Anderson's first movie for the company.

Platt passed away on July 27, 2011, in Brooklyn, New York, after battling ALS (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis). She was survived by her brother Jack Platt, who has since passed in 2015; two daughters, Antonia Bogdanovich and Alexandra "Sashy" Bogdanovich, stepdaughter Kelly Wade; stepson Jon Wade; three grandchildren; and four step-grandchildren.

"She was my film directing mentor," says Garry Marshall, who worked with Platt on his directorial debut, Young Doctors in Love. "When I was setting up a shot, I would glance over to her, and she would put her finger in her mouth and make believe she was gagging, so I'd change the shot. She was very quick and blunt—this is good, this is bad—and she could do it from 20 feet away."

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

MICHAEL & DENISE OKUDA

Michael Okuda Graphic Designer

As the Lead Graphic Designer for Star Trek, Michael Okuda has earned screen credit on more Star Trek productions than anyone except Gene Roddenberry. Michael was responsible for the control panels, computer readouts, alien written languages, and other cool stuff in Star Trek: The Next Generation through Enterprise, on Star Trek movies 4-10, and he recently served as graphics consultant on Star Trek: Picard. Other projects include graphics for the Netflix comedy Space Force, as well as The West Wing, Flight of the Intruder and The Bourne Legacy. He also consulted on Universal's Aliens Ate My Homework films, based on the beloved children's books by Bruce Coville, on Pandora, a sci-fi series for the CW, and he did motion graphics for several recent films directed by Clint Eastwood, including Sully and Richard Jewell.


Michael's life-long fascination with the real space program led him to design the crew patch for the STS-125 space shuttle mission, worn by the astronauts on space shuttle Atlantis on the final servicing flight to the Hubble Space Telescope. His NASA work also includes the emblem for NASA's Flight Operations Division, which is worn by the astronauts on the shoulder of their flight suits, the project logo for the Orion Multipurpose Crew Vehicle, the Planetary Defense Office logo, and the Spaceflight Memorial Patch (with Bill Foster), which hangs on the wall of Mission Control at NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston. Other space-related work includes designs for the Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex, The Planetary Society, Space Center Houston, and the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum.

Michael currently serves as a technical advisor on the Apple TV+ space drama For All Mankind, on which he works with

the writers, cast and directors to maintain help consistency in the technical show's scenes. Michael has been recognized with three Primetime Emmy nominations Best Visual Effects and with NASA's Exceptional Public Service Medal. He served as a technical consultant to Star Trek's writing staff, wrote the text

for Star Trek: Ships of the Line, and with Rick Sternbach is coauthor of the Star Trek: The Next Generation Technical Manual.

Michael graduated from the University of Hawai'i at Manoa with a bachelor's degree in communications and is a member of the Art Directors Guild, the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, the Visual Effects Society, and is an affiliate member of the Manned Spaceflight Operations Association, an organization of real-life NASA flight controllers and flight directors. Mike thinks science is the coolest thing ever and he really wants to be the first Graphic Artist in space.



Denise Okuda

Graphic Designer

Denise Okuda served as video/computer playback supervisor and Graphic Artist for Star Trek: Deep Space Nine, Star Trek: Voyager and Star Trek: Enterprise, as well as for four Star Trek movies made during that period. Her other credits include pilots for Threshold, Star Patrol!, The Flash and The Osiris Chronicles. Denise recently served as a graphics consultant on the Netflix series Space Force and on the Netflix/ Nickelodeon animated series Glitch Techs. She co-wrote the catalog for the Christie's auction of Star Trek costumes and props in 2006, has helped to curate and been a writer for several Star Trek museum exhibitions, and did promotional work for

20th Century Fox's cult classic, The Adventures of Buckaroo Banzai: Across the Eighth Dimension.

Denise even appeared on screen as an extra in Star Trek: The Motion Picture, where she was part of the Enterprise crew assembled on the ship's recreation deck (she's hard to spot, but she's a Vulcan crew member), as well as a background Starfleet officer in digitally

remastered effects scenes of the original *Star Trek* series in 2006.


Denise was an artistic consultant, along with her husband Michael, for CBS Home Entertainment's remastered version of Star Trek: The Next Generation. They were creative producers for new visual effects for the HD remastered version of the original Star Trek series. They have done voice and text commentaries for numerous CBS and Paramount Star Trek DVDs and Blu-ray releases, and even did a comedic in-universe text commentary for the Blu-ray of Galaxy Quest. Denise and Michael wrote several editions of The Star Trek Encyclopedia (in both print and digital formats), two editions of The Star Trek Chronology: The History of the Future and On Board the USS Enterprise.

Denise and Michael were co-producers on The Roddenberry Vault, for CBS Home Entertainment and on the feature-length documentary Star Trek: Journey to the Silver Screen for Paramount Home Entertainment. They served on the Smithsonian Institution's special advisory committee on the starship Enterprise filming model, and currently serve as advisors for the Gene Roddenberry Archive project.

Denise currently works as a technical advisor on the Apple TV+ space drama For

All Mankind, on which she works with the writers, cast and directors to help maintain consistency in the show's technical scenes. Drawing on her bachelor of science degree in nursing, Denise has also served as a medical consultant to the writing staff of Star Trek and did database work for the Art Directors Guild. She is an ardent fan of the National Football League and has been honored with the Spectrum Award, presented by the Cal State Los Angeles Eagle Con.

Denise is a member of the Art Directors Guild and wishes she could live in Yosemite National Park. She actually lives happily in Los Angeles, California, with her husband and their dogs, Amber Joy and Scooter T. Rocketboy.





LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

DONNA CLINE

Concept Illustrator and Storyboard Artist

For Donna Cline, it was always about responding to visual images and making art. From childhood, living near the Mississippi River in Arkansas, then later in Southern California, there was a fascination with the images afforded by botany and biology, and how the structure and function of the natural world occurred.

It is little wonder that an intense interest in the visual elements of the biological sciences, particularly in that of human physiology, manifested during academic years. Involvement and completion of graduate work in biomedical illustration formalized these interests, including those of cadaver dissection, and the study of the human body, from a cellular level to gross

anatomy and organ systems. A visualization of the detail of structure and of function of anatomical structures required a highly detailed manner of drawing and became very useful in illustrations and designs in the film and TV industry. Truly, there was no way to predict how impactful this technical training would soon be in a budding career in entertainment.

Cline was providing surgical medical illustrations for radiation oncology surgeons in Long Beach, CA, when she met some assistant directors and a Production Designer in the film industry. The Production Designer, Dan Lomino, generously allowed her to shadow him on the pilot of *MacGyver* and was soon able to hire her to produce





some highly technical cellular images for a Wes Craven film, *Deadly Friend*. Wes Craven became her mentor, particularly in a post-production capacity, allowing her to attend meetings and to understand the process of choreography of all dimensions of a production, to produce the final product. This was an invaluable experience.

In 1989, Cline was subsequently asked to assist on a Disney film, *Gross Anatomy*, as a means of gaining access to medical school labs and to train the cast on the academic aspects. She was able to join the IATSE union, Local 790, on this film due to the need to design five highly technical stages of cadaver dissection and to assist the makeup EFX group, KNB, in their production of these bodies for use in the lab scenes.

Cline was asked to provide visuals and function as a technical advisor on a Disney feature, *The Doctor*, with the lead actor, William Hurt, directed by Randa Haines. This was, with no doubt, one of the most demanding technical endeavors in the film industry with which Cline would be involved. It is also the film of which she is most proud, due to the ethical and professional standard-of-care issues that were fearlessly addressed.

Cline continued to work continuously in the industry for the next 27 years,



never looking back. This career had a "tapestry-like" quality, comprised of many features, television, specialized projects and technical research. Many projects had no anatomical technical content (Tombstone, George of the Jungle, The Flintstones, The X-Files, etc.) and many were intensely technical, (Bones, Red Dragon, Mulholland Falls).

Interestingly, this involvement in film and television became a conduit for the pursuit of other professional interests, such a forensic artist, law enforcement (LA County Sheriff's Department Reserve Deputy), and in psychology, all of which would become formalized as simultaneously held careers, by virtue of additionally earned graduate degrees (an MA in marriage & family therapy and a PhD in clinical psychology).

One interest led to the next and most importantly, each professional discipline became very useful on the entertainment projects with which she was subsequently involved.

Writer/Director/Editor

Denis Villeneuve is an Academy Award®nominated French Canadian filmmaker best known for having directed Blade Runner 2049, Arrival, Sicario, Prisoners, Incendies and most recently, Dune.

Villeneuve was born on October 3, 1967, and raised in the small village of Gentilly, located northeast of Montreal in Quebec on the St. Lawrence River. He was the oldest of four children. Villeneuve attended the University of Quebec in Montreal. He was a student there when he signed up for a Canadian television competition called La Course Destination Monde. Participants were given a camera and every week, were expected to shoot a five-minute piece in a different country. The competition lasted for seven months. Villeneuve won first place in the contest in 1991.

Today, Villeneuve is one of the most respected and sought-after directors. His astute attention to detail and unique visuals has established him as one of the premier filmmakers working in film. Villeneuve was nominated for an Academy Award for his directorial work on the sci-fi thriller Arrival which also received eight additional Oscar nominations and one win. Blade Runner 2049 followed with five Academy Award nominations and two wins.

Dune, the highly acclaimed film adaptation of Frank Herbert's science fiction novel, tells the story of the son of a noble family entrusted with the protection of the most valuable asset and most vital element in the galaxy. The film, which stars Timothée Chalamet, Rebecca Ferguson, Oscar Isaac, Josh Brolin, Stellan Skarsgård, Dave Bautista, Zendaya, Jason Momoa, Charlotte Rampling and Javier Bardem, has received 10 Oscar nominations. Dune: Part 2 will be released in October 2023.

"I started in documentaries. I started alone with a camera. Alone. Totally alone. Shooting, editing short documentaries. So, to deal with the camera alone, to approach reality alone, meant so much. I made a few dozen small documentaries, and that was the birth of a way to approach reality with a camera." – Denis Villeneuve






