





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
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FROM THE ADG PRESIDENT

Tonight's jubilant gala, honoring achievements in narrative design, is the Art Directors Guild's annual celebration of professional excellence by the narrative designers of film, television, streaming, commercials, animation, and other forms of media.

The 3,200-plus-member Art Directors Guild is comprised of four major craft areas, encompassing wide-ranging skill areas, including Illustration & Matte Artists; Scenic, Title, & Graphic Artists; Set Design & Model Making; and Art Direction & Production Design. Each of these four Craft Councils have selected an exceptional member to honor with their Lifetime Achievement Award for career contributions to their craft legacies. Thomas.

Tonight, the Art Directors Guild honors the legacy of a monumentally influential visual storyteller, Lawrence Paull—with an induction into the ADG Hall of Fame, where his industry contributions in design and storytelling will be an inspiration for future generations.

Highlighting this year's festivities will be the presentation of our esteemed Cinematic Imagery Award to iconic filmmaker Mimi Leder, whose incredible storytelling has launched careers and captivated audiences with her creation of impactful film and television. Since graduating as the first female cinematography graduate from the American Film Institute (AFI), Mimi has crafted an award-winning career that has stretched the imagination, while creating indelible archetypal images through her collaborations with Production Designers.

Our beautiful ADG trophy, the Cinemagundi, takes its name from the club formed in 1924 by 64 Hollywood Art Directors, and through time evolved into the Art Directors Guild. These member-designed crystal creations will find new homes with tonight's honorees.

We are blessed to be a part of an exciting, evolving profession with so many opportunities to express our creativity and talents, while fostering an increasingly dynamic, diverse, and international narrative design community. What a wonderful occasion to celebrate incredible visual storytellers and artists. While enjoying this evening's festivities, I hope you make some new friends, meet future colleagues, discover new facets of narrative design, and learn about many of the great visual storytellers who make the ADG the unique organization that has changed the way people have told and viewed stories for almost 100 years.

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FROM THE AD COUNCIL CHAIR

Tonight marks the 28th Annual Art Directors Guild Awards and it's my great pleasure to extend a warm welcome to you all. This year, we gather to celebrate the unparalleled vision and artistry that have defined the visual narrative of films, television series, commercials, and short-format projects that have left an indelible mark on audiences worldwide.

We are here to shine a spotlight on the extraordinary Production Designers and their teams, whose innovation and dedication have set new benchmarks in storytelling. Their work has not only enchanted us with mesmerizing visuals but has also deeply moved us, transporting us across imaginative realms and connecting us with the heart of each story. These talented individuals have not only contributed to the expansive canvas of filmmaking but have also honed their unique crafts to become true artisans within our vibrant film community.

This year, our Lifetime Achievement Award will be bestowed upon four distinguished members of our Guild, each of whom has enriched the cinematic landscape through decades of service across a vast array of genres:

Wynn P. Thomas stands as a pioneering figure in the world of production design, marking his entry into the ADG in 1990; he is the first African American Production Designer. His career is distinguished by a vast and varied portfolio that showcases his innovative spirit and deep commitment to the art of visual storytelling. Thomas's versatility is evident in his collaborations with directors such as Ron Howard on *A Beautiful Mind* and *Cinderella Man*, Tim Burton on *Mars Attacks!* and Harold Ramis on *Analyze This*. Thomas's collaboration with Spike Lee is particularly notable, having crafted the visual aesthetics for seminal films such as *Do the Right Thing, School Daze*, and *Malcolm X*.

Storyboard Artist David Lowery's 36-year career includes more than 100 award-winning blockbuster films, with many of Hollywood's greatest directors, including *Jurassic Park, The Lion King* and all three Sam Raimi *Spider-Man* films. He was the Co-head of Story on *Shrek*, as well as Head of Storyboards and associate producer on every episode of *The Mandalorian*. His contributions to the cinematic art of storytelling through his storyboards are a testament to his great talent.

Greg Papalia, Set Designer, began his career designing sets for now-classic films, including *Coming to America*, *Die Hard 2, Father of the Bride* and *The Patriot*. As his skill and reputation grew, Papalia added the title of Art Director to his resume, but combined that new role with his previous one. He has served as both Art Director and Set Designer on projects including *Air, Godzilla vs. Kong, Hail, Caesarl* and *Those Who Wish Me Dead*.

Scenic Artist Francine West was the first female Scenic Artist ever hired to work on film and television by both MGM and the NBC Television Network, as well as the first woman to be a charge artist at Grosh Scenic Studios in Hollywood. During her career, she worked at the ABC, NBC, and CBS scenic shops, on television shows, including Frank Sinatra: A Man and His Music, The Carol Burnett Show and Three's Company. She also worked on live event programs such as The Academy Awards, The Emmy Awards and Super Bowl XVII.

This year, we are overjoyed to honor Mimi Leder with the ADG Cinematic Imagery Award, recognizing her exceptional contributions as producer and director. The Cinematic Imagery Award is bestowed upon those whose body of work in film and/or television has richly enhanced the visual aspects of the media. Previous recipients include Baz Luhrmann, Jane Campion, Steven Spielberg, Christopher Nolan, Martin Scorsese and George Lucas.

Leder currently serves as executive producer and director of the hit series *The Morning Show*. Having received two Emmy Awards and eight additional nominations over her illustrious career, she is the first female graduate of AFI and continues to be a groundbreaking trailblazer for women in the industry. She has directed and produced films, including *On the Basis of Sex, Deep Impact, The Peacemaker* and television shows such as *The Leftovers, Luck, Shameless* and *The West Wing*. Mimi Leder is a visionary director and producer, whose collaboration with her art departments demonstrates the heights that we can achieve in filmmaking.

As we honor these visionaries, the Art Directors Guild is taking special recognition to install Lawrence G. Paull into our Hall of Fame. Paull, an Oscar-nominated Production Designer, helped create the futuristic universe for 1982's *Blade Runner*, as well as the time-traveling nostalgic settings for *Back to the Future*. Additional notable film credits include *Romancing the Stone, City Slickers, Harlem Nights* and *Escape from LA*. Paull's career extended to over dozens of TV movies and feature films and included collaboration with numerous renowned directors the likes of Ridley Scott, Robert Mulligan, and Robert Zemeckis.

I am additionally honored to acknowledge the extraordinary dedication of the ADG Awards Committee. Special mention to Michael Allen Glover and Megan Elizabeth Bell, who return as producers this year. Their exceptional work, alongside Debbie Patton, Suzy Dyer, and the entire Guild staff, is the cornerstone of making tonight's event a reality. Their year-round commitment to organizing this grand event and promoting the significance of the Art Directors Guild Awards within Hollywood deserves our deepest gratitude.

I extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone present tonight. It is a privilege to honor the film industry and celebrate the remarkable talents within the Art Directors Guild.



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FROM THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Welcome to the 28th Annual Art Directors Guild Excellence in Production Design Awards. We are excited to return to the Ray Dolby Ballroom for this year's show.

The Guild is honored to award this year's ADG Cinematic Imagery Award to director Mimi Leder and to induct Lawrence G. Paull into our ADG Hall of Fame. Longtime ADG members who will receive our Lifetime Achievement Award tonight are Production Designer Wynn P. Thomas, Storyboard Artist David Lowery, Senior Set Designer Greg Papalia and Scenic Artist Francine West.

2023 was another banner year for filmed entertainment. Even though the total number of projects was smaller due to the strikes, the boundaries between the genres of television and feature films continued to dissolve. Highly detailed period settings appeared in linear single-camera, one-hour episodic television shows, as well as in feature films and streaming. The trend also continued for the depiction of high-concept, high-budget sci-fi to thrive on streaming platforms.

It was our members, as well as our sisters and brothers who live and work outside of our IATSE jurisdiction, who brought to life shows that took place in period New Mexico, a make-believe World of Pink, 19th-century New York City, mid-century Los Angeles, early-'60s Borscht Belt, interplanetary surfaces...the list of possible environments is innumerable. Luring the audience into a state of suspended disbelief requires every single one to be well grounded and authentic, regardless of wherever and whenever the script takes place.

That is what we are celebrating tonight.

So, please join us as we honor not just those nominated and the ultimate winners, but all of us who have dedicated our lives and professional careers to perfect our craft.



David Lowery

SR. ILLUSTRATOR/STORYBOARD ARTIST




called back, launching his career in television, animation, advertising, and finally, film.

David has worked on more than 100 award-winning blockbuster films with many of Hollywood's greatest directors. An early opportunity storyboarding at ILM with Ron Howard and Joe Johnston on Willow was, as David recounts, "like storyboard grad school." David became eligible to join the Art Directors Guild on Johnston's The Rocketeer. Shortly thereafter, he began working on Jurassic Park, which led to a long association with Steven Spielberg. During that time, he storyboarded a multitude of Amblin and DreamWorks projects, including Hook, The Lost World: Jurassic Park, Twister, Deep Impact, Galaxy Quest, Jurassic World, Indiana Jones and the Crystal Skull, and was even the Co-head of Story on Shrek, with DreamWorks Animation. In the years following, he had the pleasure of collaborating with numerous top directors: Ron Howard (Backdraft, How the Grinch Stole Christmas); Francis Ford Coppola (Dracula); Bob Zemeckis (Death Becomes Her); James Cameron (True Lies), Tom Shadyac (Bruce Almighty, Evan Almighty) and a myriad of others. Most notably, his long associations with Sam Raimi on the Spider-Man films (2002, 2004, 2007) and most extensively with Jon Favreau, beginning with Iron Man (2008).



David Lowery was born in Chicago as the youngest of five boys, but moved to California when he was 3 years old. He grew up in Anaheim, which David describes as being "in the shadow of the great papier-mâché Matterhorn." His father and uncle went to art school together, and as a result, he and his brothers were encouraged to draw at a very young age. David always knew he would make his living drawing, starting early as the school newspaper cartoonist in both high school and college. He worked commercial art staff jobs to pay his way through art school at California State University Long Beach, where he earned a BFA in Illustration. David likes to say, "When you get out of school, you get a chance to do a lot of different types of work, but only some of them call you back for more." In David's case, it was Hollywood that





David's long-running collaboration with Jon Favreau continued with Cowboys & Aliens, Couples Retreat and more. Their work together developed into David's position as Head of Storyboards on the liveaction/animation hybrid films The Jungle Book and The Lion King, where he led a team of Illustrators and 2D animatic artists. David has continued in that role on every episode of The Mandalorian which garnered him associate producer credit on the series.

David has an extensive array of guild associations and has enjoyed mentoring up-and-coming Illustrators as guest lecturer at prestigious art and animation schools. He joined the Art Directors Guild in 1989, where he

served on the Executive Board and continues to be a valuable contributor to the Comic-Con Committee. His other affiliations include The Animation Guild, the Directors Guild of America, which has allowed him to work as a 2nd unit director, the Television Academy, and the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, where he is on the Production Design Branch Executive Committee.

David lives in Los Angeles with his wife Susie, and together, they share a passion for drawing, painting, and jazz. They have two grown children, Nellie and Charlie, who have both spent time working in Hollywood art departments.



Francine West


SCENIC ARTIST

Francine West has painted all her life but began serious study at Dallas Art Institute at the age of 8. She painted her first 50-foot backdrop at age 15. At 16, she received a scholarship from Coronado School of Fine Arts. In 1965, Francine was the first woman Scenic Artist hired at NBC television network in Burbank, CA.


West has painted hundreds of large-scale murals, sets and backdrops for television, including NBC, ABC, and CBS (where she was a staff Scenic Artist for four years), and film, including Warner Bros., Paramount, and Universal Studios. Her work included sets for *Carol Burnett, Three's Company, All in the Family, Archie Bunker's Place, The Johnny Carson Show*, to name a few. In 1984, she was the first woman Scenic Artist hired at MGM Studios. Francine also served as Vice President at the Scenic, Title and Graphic Artists, Local 816.

Francine worked at Grosh Scenic Studios in Hollywood, where she painted projects for Epcot Center, including a 25-foot x 300-foot mural for the Mexico Pavilion, and she worked on the ceiling mural and balloons for the Land Pavilion. She was promoted to charge artist at Grosh and painted a figure for Rod Stewart that was 40 feet by 160 feet, along with murals for the Gerald Ford Museum, NASA Museum, and Disney World.

She has painted backdrops for theater, ballet (including Sacramento Ballet, Long Beach Ballet, Santa Barbara Ballet, Capital City Ballet, and Peninsula School of Dance) and opera, many in a 20-foot x 50-foot, or 30-foot x 60-foot format. In 1985, West became the Scenic Artist at CSUS. She also found time to graduate magna cum laude with a BA degree in studio art in 1999. In 2000, she studied painting and art restoration at Studio Art Center International in Florence, Italy. After retiring from CSUS in 2004, Francine has worked on a theater restoration mural at El Campanil Theatre in Antioch, CA, and painted murals in private homes and businesses, including Cal Expo, Giftique, and San Tomo.








Francine was interviewed recently by Sidney Carlson. She reflected on her career going back to the 1960s. Things were very different then. She said, "If you just keep doing something, something will happen. Keep going until it gets better. I was the first woman to work in the MGM scenic shop. I tried to walk through doors that women hadn't walked through before. I felt an obligation for all the other women that might want to do it, to not mess up. I wanted to work really really hard and be good."

Francine, her husband Ed West, daughter/son-in-law Kerry and Bobby Pal and granddaughters Kaylee Boling and Laleeta Pal currently live in Shingle Springs, CA.











Greg Papalia

SET DESIGNER/ART DIRECTOR



Greg Papalia was born and raised on the westside of Los Angeles, growing up in the shadow of MGM Studios and all of their many backlot facilities which at the time, occupied a sizable area of Culver City. As a child, he remembers passing MGM's Lot 3's two-mile-long green fence along Jefferson Boulevard over which he could just catch glimpses of the magic beyond. Even as a kid, Greg was intrigued by the little bits of architecture that jutted up above the fence top, hinting of stories depicting both history and adventure. Also nearby was the backlot of Desilu Studios, which one could clearly see as it sat along and below Jefferson Boulevard, just a little to the east. It had once been the backlot of Selznick Studios where the burning of Atlanta was filmed for *Gone with the Wind*. The remnants of the great studios are what he grew up around, and while no one in his family worked in the film business, much of Los Angeles and Culver City was a company town that in some way, he felt a part of.

And so, it was only natural, upon graduating from high school in 1975 and needing a job, it made perfect sense for Greg to drive over to MGM, walk into the Thalberg Building (pretty much anybody could in those days) and ask if they could use someone like him, a high school-aged kid with a bad haircut and not much to offer except a willingness to do anything. Turns out that was just what they were looking for!


Two weeks after turning 18, and two lengthy interviews later, Greg found himself working in the mailroom of the biggest and most respected studio around. To say he considered himself lucky would be an understatement! At the same time, he had no idea of the 50-year adventure that lay ahead.

Papalia spent a year and a half in the mailroom before moving into the production department, where he was taught to be what today is considered to be a production coordinator. The difference between that time and today is the production coordinator today is dedicated to a single production. Back then, in the mid-'70s, all the films and television shows were run out of a central production department. Two coordinators were responsible for working with every producer, UPM and 1st AD for every show going on at any given time. His job was to coordinate all the information required to move each production's shooting day forward, from one day to the next.

In addition to his duties in the production department, he was required to be on call for the art department when things got busy. His duty was to cover all the needs of the Art Directors, Set Designers, and Illustrators when the Head of the Department was out. Over the three years he spent "part time" in the art department, he found he felt most at home when working with creative people dedicated to telling a story using a visual approach.

After those initial three years in production, activity picked up in the art department. More help was needed, and Greg was invited to move full time into the department he had always wanted to be a part of. At that time, every film and television show all worked out of the same art department space. All the Art Directors and Illustrators were in the offices in the back of the building while all the Set Designers for every production worked together in the drafting room up front. Greg had a unique opportunity to see at one time, a tremendous variety of work and talents, not to mention experience it right before his eyes. The only thing he had to figure out was how to take advantage of such an opportunity.

So, while making coffee and running blueprints during the day, he began to teach himself to draw, after everyone else went home at night. Setting out his own coursework was challenging but he was fortunate to be surrounded by some vastly experienced people, who were more than generous with their time and knowledge. Many of those folks today are in the ADG Hall of Fame. To give readers an idea of who contributed to his education and spent time hovering over his drawing board correcting his mistakes, here is a list of just a few names. Some might be familiar, others not. Either way, it would be remiss in not mentioning them and the



debt Greg owes for their generosity and teaching: Mentor Huebner, Ed Carfagno, Ted Haworth, Roy Barnes, Preston Ames, Arnold "Buddy" Gillespie, Tony Villone, Charles Rosen, Bill Kenney, Diane Wager, Ken Adam, Richard MacDonald, Les Gobruegge, Albert Brenner, Richard McKenzie, Perry Grey, Joel Schiller, and Larry Paull. It was important to them that he learn all they had to teach and not embarrass them when he finally got into the union and joined their ranks. It is these standards of design and professionalism he continues to practice to this day.

To further illustrate the atmosphere and level of experience Papalia was surrounded by, and the depth of knowledge offered to him, some

of the credits of those he worked side-by-side with are films such as Ben-Hur, An American in Paris, The Wizard of Oz, Quo Vadis, The Longest Day, North by Northwest, The Graduate, Rosemary's Baby, The Good Earth, Mutiny on the Bounty, Boys Town and Logan's Run, just to name a few.

Upon entering the union after seven years at MGM, Papalia then went on to set design for 10 years before becoming an Art Director and a Supervising Art Director for 20-plus years, with time off occasionally to continue as a Set Designer. In the last dozen years, Greg has returned




to set design, with a specialty in contributing to the concept phase of a project, occasionally working as an Art Director when there's enough fun and adventure involved. He honestly finds set design to be the more gratifying pursuit!

But what Greg considers his greatest accomplishment overall is to have worked on and contributed to more than 100 films and television productions, all while raising two sons, and remaining married throughout all the ups-and-downs that are inevitable in this business.

Mimi Leder



The Art Directors Guild is thrilled to have the opportunity to honor the achievements of Mimi Leder with this year's Outstanding Contribution to Cinematic Imagery Award. We recognize the amazing talents and creative contributions she has made to narrative design and imaginative storytelling, while so beautifully creating an incredible legacy. It is with great pleasure that we celebrate Mimi Leder here tonight.

Multiple-Emmy Award-winning director and producer Mimi Leder is the visionary storyteller behind some of the most acclaimed dramas in film and television, forging a path for a generation of filmmakers. Owning many "firsts," Leder was the first woman accepted into the AFI Conservatory's

cinematography program, and per the request of Steven Spielberg, helmed the first-ever feature film for DreamWorks SKG—the George Clooney and Nicole Kidman-led action drama, *The Peacemaker*. Most notably, her film *Deep Impact* for Paramount Pictures, which earned more than \$350 million at the worldwide box office, was the highest-grossing film ever made by a female director and held that record for a decade.

Leder began her directing career on the seminal legal drama *L.A. Law*, and she quickly established herself as one of the most sought-after directors in television. Her work has received numerous industry honors and out of the 10 pilots she has directed, seven have gone straight to series. *ER*

earned Leder various accolades, including two Emmy Awards and four nominations, as well as three prestigious DGA Award nominations for Outstanding Directorial Achievement in a Dramatic Series. In 2019, her film *On the Basis of Sex*, won the first-ever Women in Film Members Choice Award. She was also the recipient of the American Film Institute's Franklin J. Schaffner Award, and in 2000, received the Women in Film Crystal Award and distinguished Dorothy Arzner Directors Award. Most recently, Leder earned her 10th Emmy Award nomination for directing the season 1 finale of *The Morning Show*.

In 2018, Leder's inspiring drama, *On the Basis of Sex*, was released by Participant Media and Focus Features. Told in the 25th anniversary year of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's Supreme Court appointment, the film stars Felicity Jones as Ginsburg and details her journey as a law student and young attorney as she brings a groundbreaking gender-equality case before the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit. This would ultimately forge Ginsburg's path to the Supreme Court, overturning a century of sex-discrimination laws. Premiering to critical acclaim, the film shows the resilience and tenacity of one of the most memorable women in US history, who faced discrimination and sexism. The film was awarded a Humanitas Prize for Drama Feature Film and a Women's Image Network Award for Outstanding Film.

series, The Morning Show, which received its Season 4 greenlight prior to its Season 3 premiere. Season 3 most recently earned a coveted spot on the American Film Institute's prestigious list of the 10 Best Films and Television Programs of the Year, as well as two Golden Globe nominations for Best TV Drama and Best Supporting Actor (for Billy Crudup), in addition to leading as the most-nominated series for the 29th Annual Critics Choice Awards with six nominations, with Billy Crudup winning Best Supporting Actor. With an all-star cast lead by Jennifer Aniston and Reese Witherspoon, Seasons 1 and 2 were also widely regarded by fans and critics alike, garnering SAG, Golden Globe, Critics Choice and Emmy nominations—including Leder earning her 10th Emmy nomination for directing the Season 1 finale. Leder helmed the flagship series, which quickly became a global hit and broadly acclaimed for its unapologetic and provocative storytelling. The series continuously explores topical themes, including the #MeToo movement, racism, LGBTQ+ issues, abortion rights, cancel culture, the pandemic, and provides a behind-the-scenes look at the everchanging world of journalism. The show, in its third season, has officially become the most watched series globally on AppleTV+.

Leder resides in Los Angeles with her husband, actor Gary Werntz.

On the television side, in addition to her signature work on ER. Leder served as directing showrunner and executive producer on HBO's critically acclaimed and Peabody Award-winning series The Leftovers. Other television credits include Showtime's irreverent comedy Shameless and hit broadcast series Crime Story, the Aaron Sorkin-political powerhouse The West Wing, the groundbreaking series China Beach, for both producing and directing and HBO's Luck. Leder has earned four Emmy nominations for China Beach and an Emmy nomination for Outstanding Directing for a Drama Series on The West Wing.

Leder returned as executive producer and director of the highly anticipated Apple TV+



Lawrence Paull



Lawrence G. Paull was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1938. He enrolled at the University of Arizona with the intention of studying architecture. However, after viewing the film *Doctor Zhivago* (1965), Paull became inspired to change his course of study and pursue film instead.

He began his professional career in 1970 as the Art Director for the motorcycle movie *Little Fauss and Big Halsy* (1970). Paull's career took off almost immediately as he moved on to work as a Production Designer on movies like the Western *The Hired Hand* (1971) and the comedy *The Naked Ape* (1973). As Paull's experience and reputation grew, he graduated to more prominent projects like the radio-themed comedy *FM* (1978). Then in 1982, Paull designed Ridley Scott's landmark science fiction noir, *Blade Runner* (1982), for which he was nominated for an

Academy Award, and won the BAFTA Award for Art Direction/Production Design. The aesthetic distinctiveness he achieved on the film proved to be career-making, and his name grew in popularity as the movie moved from underground favorite to art house hit.

His next major project was the blockbuster hit *Romancing the Stone* (1984), a film that included numerous exotic themes and locales, followed by the mega-hit *Back to the Future* (1985), which required many distinctive elements, including extensive 1950s period design. Paull proved extremely adept with historical design elements, designing Eddie Murphy's directorial debut, the 1930s-set gangster comedy *Harlem Nights* (1989). He went on to do production design on several popular films over the coming years, including the comedy *City Slickers* (1991), and the remake of the classic film *Born Yesterday* (1993). Paull's final feature film was the thriller *Light It Up* (1999).

His early career as Art Director includes more than 20 TV movies and feature films by such celebrated directors as Robert Mulligan, Delbert Mann, and Lamont Johnson. He also designed the Emmy-winning Friendly Fire (1979); Oprah Winfrey's ABC miniseries The Wedding (1998); David Greene's Rehearsal for Murder (1982); Burt Reynolds' Hard Time (1998); and James Keach's Murder in the Mirror (2000).

He also worked on Peter Fonda's *The Hired Hand* (1971); *The Bingo Long Traveling All-Stars & Motor Kings* (1976); *American Flyers* (1985) and *Another Stakeout* (1993), all directed by John Badham; John Carpenter's *Memoirs of an Invisible Man* (1992) and *Escape From L.A.* (1996); Jonathan Kaplan's *Project X* (1987) and *Unlawful Entry* (1992); Jon Avildsen's *W.W. and the Dixie Dance Kings* (1975); and Paul Schrader's *Blue Collar* (1978).





Following his retirement from the motion picture industry, Paull joined the faculty of Chapman University and was senior filmmaker-in-residence at AFI. He created the curriculum required for masters in production design at each school, working with adjunct faculty on the format and content of each course. He also was a guest speaker at Harvard, USC, UCLA, Catholic University and his alma mater, University of Arizona.



Wynn P. Thomas is a graduate of Boston University. He got his BFA in theatre design. He started his career designing sets for the theatre. He was the resident designer for the world-famous Negro Ensemble Company. And he also designed sets for Joe Papp's Public Theatre, Arena Stage in Washington, DC, Great Lakes Shakespeare Company in Cleveland, Ohio, and the Long Wharf Theatre in New Haven.

Wynn is the first African American Production Designer in the history of films. As an Assistant Art Director, he worked with distinguished production designers Richard Sylbert on *The Cotton Club*, Patrizia von Brandenstein on *Beat Street* and *The Money Pit*, and Stuart Wurtzel on *Brighton Beach Memories*.

He also assisted on *The Package* with Gene Hackman. As a Production Designer, Wynn has worked with some of the most important film directors of the 20th century. For director Ron Howard and producer Brian Grazer, he designed *A Beautiful Mind*, which won the Academy Award for Best Picture and designed the critically acclaimed *Cinderella Man*, both starring Russell Crowe.

Wynn was the in-house designer for Robert De Niro's Tribeca Productions. For them, he designed *A Bronx Tale*, directed by Robert De Niro, *Wag the Dog*, directed by Barry Levinson, starring Robert De Niro and Dustin Hoffman. He also designed *Analyze This* and *Analyze That*, directed by Harold Ramis and starring De Niro and Billy Crystal. For director Tim Burton, he designed the cult classic *Mars Attacks!*

Wynn has a long-term collaborative relationship with Spike Lee. Starting with She's Gotta Have It, School Daze, Do the Right Thing, Mo' Better Blues, Jungle Fever, the epic film Malcolm X, Crooklyn, He Got Game, Kings of Comedy, Inside Man. And his most recent project with Spike was Da 5 Bloods, which was shot in Thailand and Vietnam. Wynn won the ADG Award for Best Contemporary Design for his work on Da 5 Bloods.

Other films that Wynn has designed include the drag queen classic comedy *To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything, Julie Newmar,* directed by Beeban Kidron, starring Patrick Swayze, and Wesley Snipes. For actor-director Edward Norton, he designed *Keeping the Faith. Breach,* a thriller written and directed by Billy Ray. *All Good Things* with Ryan Gosling and Kirsten Dunst. *The Odd Life of Tomothy Green,* which was written and directed by Peter Hedges. For Warner Bros., he designed *Get Smart* with Steve Carell and Anne Hathaway and *Grudge Match* with Robert De Niro and Sylvester Stallone. Both those films were directed by Pete Segal. *Alex Strangelove,* an early gay love story for Netflix, *The Sun Is Also a Star* for MGM. *Almost Christmas* for Universal Pictures, produced by Will





Packer and directed by David Talbert. And the most recent reboot of *Shaft*, starring Samuel L. Jackson and directed by Tim Story.

There have been some excellent projects in the last few years. Those include *Hidden Figures*, produced by Donna Gigliotti and directed by Ted Melfi and starring Taraji P. Henson and Kevin Costner. *Hidden Figures* won the Hollywood Film Award for Outstanding Production Design. And the film won an Art Directors Guild Award for Best Production Design for a Period Feature Film. *King Richard*, directed by Reinaldo Green and starring Will Smith, was nominated for the Best Picture Oscar. *Devotion* ... a Korean War epic about Jesse Brown was released this past year, as well as the comedy *80 for Brady*, starring Jane Fonda, Lily Tomlin, Sally Field, and Rita Moreno.

Wynn just finished his first television series. The project is for Paramount+ and Taylor Sheridan Productions and it's called *Lawman: Bass Reeves*. It's about Bass Reeves, the first Black US deputy marshal in Indian territory in the 1870s. The project stars David Oyelowo and Donald Sutherland.

Wynn has been a proud member of United Scenic Artists, Local 829, in

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New York for 40 years. Wynn is the first African American designer to become a member of an Art Directors Guild and the first African American to be nominated for the ADG Award for his design work on *Mars Attacks!* For the last six years, Wynn has been on the Board of Governors at the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. And for the last three years, Wynn was elected to a Vice President position on the Academy Board.

And finally, Wynn was recently honored with a five-week, 10-film retrospective of his production design work at MOMA ... the Museum of Modern Art, in New York. After this recognition, Wynn feels he can finally call himself ... an artist.







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



Honorees of the 28th Annual Art Directors Guild Awards

The ADG Art Directors Council is honored and privileged to celebrate the accomplishments of these trailblazers of our industry. Their unique contributions have shaped so many facets of the craft of filmmaking and we are so grateful to pay tribute and applaud them today.



Wynn P. Thomas

Lifetime Achievement Award

Wynn P. Thomas, a Boston University graduate in Theatre Design, began his career in set design for theatre, working with notable companies like the Negro Ensemble Company and Joe Papp's Public Theatre. He made history as the first African American Production Designer in films, assisting renowned designers on projects like "The Cotton Club" and "The Money Pit." Thomas gained acclaim for his work with directors like Ron Howard "A Beautiful Mind," "Cinderella Man," Tim Burton "Mars Attacks," and especially his long-standing collaboration with Spike Lee which includes classics like "Do the Right Thing," and "Malcolm X" to name a few. Thomas has designed a diverse range of films, from "To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything! Julie Newmar" to "Hidden Figures" and has ventured into television with "Lawman: Bass Reeves." A member of the Art Director's Guild and United Scenic Artists, he has been recognized with two ADG Awards and now a Lifetime Achievement Award. His work was recently celebrated in a ten-film retrospective at the Museum of Modern Art in New York.

Hall of Fame Inductee

Lawrence G. Paull, born in 1938 in Chicago, was initially an architecture student at the University of Arizona but switched to film after being inspired by "Doctor Zhivago." Beginning his career in 1970 as an art director, Paull quickly rose to prominence in Hollywood, notably for his work on "Blade Runner," which earned him an Academy Award nomination and a BAFTA Award. His notable projects include "Romancing the Stone," "Back to the Future," and "Harlem Nights," showcasing his versatility in production design. Paull's career extended to over 20 TV movies and feature films, working with various renowned directors. After retiring, he joined the faculty at Chapman University and AFI, contributing significantly to academic curricula in production design. Paull passed away in 2019, leaving behind a legacy in both the film industry and academia.


Cinematic Imagery Award

Mimi Leder currently serves as executive producer and director of the hit series, "The Morning Show," starring Jennifer Aniston, Reese Witherspoon and Billy Crudup. Most notably, Leder earned her tenth Emmy Award nomination for directing the Season 1 finale. "The Morning Show" is the most watched series globally on AppleTV+ and has earned multiple SAG, Golden Globe, Critics' Choice and Emmy awards nominations, and was selected as one of AFI's 10 best television programs of 2023. She is also the first female graduate of AFI and continues to be a groundbreaking trailblazer for women in the industry. "The creative relationship with our production designers is not only to create the setting but to convey emotion, character and storytelling, which is the magic that builds these immersive worlds we can dream in, and bring to life." says Leder. She is a visionary director and producer, whose collaboration with her art departments demonstrates the heights that we can achieve in filmmaking. Leder's additional awards include two Emmy wins and eight nominations, as well as three DGA nominations for her work on the iconic series "ER." She has directed and produced films including "On the Basis of Sex," "Deep Impact," "The Peacemaker" and television shows such as "The Leftovers," "Luck," "Shameless," and "The West Wing."














