



Here's to a night of celebration, inspiration, and the enduring power of creativity and community. This year, we are proud to present the Lifetime Achievement Award to four exceptional members of our Guild. Each honoree has profoundly shaped the cinematic landscape, bringing decades of dedication and artistry to a diverse range of genres. Lisa Frazza will be honored by the Scenic, Title, and Graphic Artists Council, presented by Production Designer Jack Forrestel. Renowned for her innovative techniques and exceptional eye for detail, Lisa has mastered faux finishes, wood graining, marbelizing, and mural work, bringing unparalleled artistry to her projects. Her incredible career includes contributions to hundreds of productions at CBS Television Studios, such as Wheel of Fortune, Jeopardy!, The Late Late Show with James Corden, Dancing with the Stars, Survivor, and an impressive 16-year run on The Bold and the Beautiful. Lisa's journey as an artist began with early inspirations from visiting The Met, the New York City Ballet, and Radio City Music Hall. Starting her career in scenic

design for stage plays and operas, she quickly rose to prominence as one of the few female scenic artists of her time. Her colleagues hold her in the highest regard for her reliability, on-set expertise, and trailblazing contributions. Beyond her artistic achievements, Lisa has served as a Guild Board and Council member, chaired the Scholarship Committee for a decade, and championed initiatives like the flex plan while mentoring countless emerging artists, cementing her legacy as a leader and advocate in the field. Barbara Mesney will receive the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Set Designers & Model Makers Council, presented by Art Director Dawn Swiderski. Over the past three decades, Barbara has lent her incredible talent to dozens of award-winning films, including Argo, Hail, Caesar!, Gone Girl, Anchorman, Captain America: The Winter Soldier, Crazy, Stupid, Love, Con Air, and Matilda. Barbara began her career in scenic design and art direction for the stage, earning numerous Dramalogue and Bay Area Theatre Critics Awards as an associate designer at the American Conservatory Theatre. Her transition to set design for film began in 1989 with Class Action, and her meticulous hand-drawn draftings and ability to bring concepts to life have been an enduring hallmark of her work. In addition to her set design career, Barbara has painted in oils for over 30 years and dedicates time to volunteering with the Best Friends Animal Society. Her legacy of creativity and precision continues to inspire and elevate the art of set design. Dan Sweetman will be honored by the Illustrators and Matte Artists Council,





presented by Storyboard Artist David Lowery. Over his 30-year career, Dan has worked on more than 100 films, contributing to iconic projects such as Braveheart, Contact, Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone, Spider-Man, The Prestige, Alice in Wonderland, Birdman, and the newly released Mufasa: The Lion King. Dan's career began in illustration for renowned publications like the LA Times and The New York Times, as well as for Vertigo and DC Comics. His ability to seamlessly translate scripts into visual narratives has earned him collaborations with directors such as Mel Gibson, Peter Weir, Chris Columbus, George Miller, and Christopher Nolan. Dan's artistry and intuitive storytelling continue to shape the way we experience cinema, leaving an enduring impact on the industry. The Art Directors Council will be presenting J. Dennis Washington with the Lifetime Achievement Award, presented by agent Ann Murtha. With a career spanning over 50 years, Dennis has designed some of the most beloved films in cinema history, including Stand by Me, The Fugitive, Dante's Peak, White Men Can't Jump, Nebraska, and *Thirteen Days.* He also collaborated with legendary director John Huston on three films, showcasing his exceptional ability to craft immersive, visually stunning worlds. Born in Santa Monica, California, Dennis initially pursued architecture before discovering his true calling in the Art Department at MGM, where he began as a Junior Set Designer in 1965. Since then, his dedication to excellence has made him a cornerstone of the industry. Dennis's legacy as a master of production design continues to inspire generations of filmmakers and artists alike, leaving an indelible mark on the world of visual storytelling. We are equally proud to welcome Carl Jules Weyl into the Hall of Fame. Born in Stuttgart, Germany, Weyl's early architectural training in Berlin, Strasbourg, and Munich, followed by studies at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris, laid a solid foundation for his illustrious career. After immigrating to the United States in 1912, he established himself as a prominent architect in California, designing notable structures such as the Hollywood Brown Derby and contributing to the Hollywood Boulevard Commercial and Entertainment District. Transitioning to film during the Great Depression, Weyl joined Warner Bros. as an Art Director, where his designs for Casablanca, The Big Sleep, and The Adventures of Robin Hood—for which he won a Best Art Direction Oscar-remain

timeless examples of cinematic artistry. As we honor his legacy, we are reminded of the foundational work that continues to inspire our craft today. Additionally, we celebrate director Jason Reitman, recipient of this year's Cinematic Imagery Award. With films like Juno and Up in the Air, Reitman has demonstrated the profound synergy between director and Art Department, creating worlds that are as visually compelling as they are emotionally resonant. His directorial debut, Thank You for Smoking (2005), showcased his knack for sharp satire and visual storytelling. Reitman continued to explore complex narratives with Young Adult (2011) and Tully (2018), further cementing his reputation for crafting visually engaging and thought-provoking films. In 2021, he directed Ghostbusters: Afterlife, a continuation of the original series his father, lvan Reitman, made famous. His latest project, Saturday Night (2024), offers a behind-the-scenes look at the inaugural episode of *Saturday Night Live*, capturing the chaotic energy and creativity of live television. Reitman's diverse body of work underscores his commitment to visual storytelling, making him a deserving honoree of the Cinematic Imagery Award. The Art Directors Guild Awards is more than a celebration of individual achievement; it is a reflection of the collective strength, creativity, and camaraderie of our Guild and the film industry we so proudly represent. As we look to the future, we are committed to fostering an environment of opportunity, inclusion, and innovation, ensuring that every voice and vision has a place in our ever-evolving industry. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to the ADG Awards Committee, led by the incredible producers Michael Allen Glover and Megan Elizabeth Bell, whose unwavering dedication makes this event possible. Their outstanding efforts, together with Debbie Patton, Suzy Dyer, and the entire Guild staff, are the foundation of tonight's success. I want to welcome everyone here tonight to the 29th Annual Art Directors Guild Excellence in Production Design Awards. We are fortunate to hold our event here again at the InterContinental Hotel in DTLA and celebrate the collective achievements in narrative design of those nominated for film, television, streaming,

commercials, music videos and animation.

We are also gathered here tonight in community. Our community of filmmakers has already faced the stress of a year and a half of drastically reduced employment due to multiple reasons that are no fault of our own. But now the added disaster of the catastrophically tragic wildfires that has befallen our beloved City of Angels has drawn us closer together, amplifying the absolute need for community.

Therefore, and in light of the precarious situation that so many of our members find themselves in, the Local 800 Art Directors Council unanimously approved a motion to donate a percentage of the proceeds from tonight's sponsorship to the IATSE's Richard F. Walsh/Alfred W. Di Tolla/Harold P. Spivak Foundation that, along with the other charitable organizations associated with show business, such as the Motion Picture Television Fund (MPTF) and the Entertainment Community Fund (ECF), have dedicated themselves to provide emergency funds and social resources for those members who have been adversely affected in historic proportions.

Throughout the night, and in support of the disaster-relief effort, we will be conducting our version of a charity telethon for affected members. Alternately, there is a table stationed outside the banquet room at which, if you prefer, you will be able to make your donation in person. There is also a silent auction underway in the pre-party space outside this ballroom.

So, again, thank you for joining us as we celebrate the achievements of those nominated in the various cited categories and please help us continue to provide aid for all those members who have suffered either the complete loss of their homes or, through evacuation, access to their homes.

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

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD LISA Frazza scenic artist



Lisa was inspired by her love of art from a young age. Her parents helped foster her love of art by scraping enough money together to send her to a private art school in their hometown of Ridgewood. NJ. Lisa could always be found in her room using crayons instead of doing chores.

The family lived 25 miles from New York City, allowing easy access to museums and theater. Lisa has early memories of visiting the Met Museum and the New York City Ballet, as well as Radio City Music Hall. She was also very fortunate to have a single aunt residing in NYC who took an interest in her. She would take her for the weekends to visit museums while her mom and dad were busy with Lisa's three younger brothers.

Lisa's parents were very active in church and community volunteering. Lisa was taught at a young age to always 'Give Back.' They had a strong commitment to volunteering and seeing it through. This kept Lisa busy and productive.

Lisa lived and worked in New York City after college ('79-'86). She attended Lester Polakov's Studio & Forum





of Stage Design in NYC ('79-'82), while continuing to work in NYC, Boston, and Philadelphia as a Scenic Artist. Off Broadway, Lisa worked on a production of *Johnny Got His Gun*, starring Jeff Daniels at The Sheridan Square Theatre. In Philadelphia, she worked under Production Designer Franco Colavecchia, as a Scenic Artist on various operas. In Boston, summer of 1986: She was a Scenic Artist on *The Witches of Eastwick*, starring Jack Nicholson. Polly Platt was the Production Designer.

Lisa belonged to two unions on the East Coast in those early years of her career: Boston IATSE Local 481 and New York City Local 829 United Scenic Artists. She moved to Los Angeles in 1986 and joined IATSE Local 816 in 1988.

Lisa spent her early days ('86-'88) in Los Angeles working on many commercials as a Scenic Artist. Lisa freelanced as a union Scenic Artist in Los Angeles from 1988 to 1991 and was elected to Local 816's Board of Directors in 1989. In 1991, she began working full time at CBS Television City as a Scenic Artist and went on staff in 1997.

She remained on the 816 Board until their merger with Local 800 in 2003. At Local 800, Lisa became a Board Officer, serving as Secretary from 2003 to 2022, as well as the Secretary for the STG Council. She also worked with the Dick Stiles Scholarship Committee from 2003 to 2005, becoming Chair in 2005-2021. The ADG is grateful for Lisa's years of service.

Lisa is recognized as an accomplished Scenic Artist, skilled in creating stunning hand-painted environments for broadcast, film and theater. She is known for her innovative techniques and keen eye for detail seen in her faux wood grain, marbelizing and mural work. Lisa worked on hundreds of TV shows during her long career at CBS, including several game shows: *Wheel of Fortune, Jeopardy!, The Price Is Right,* as well as talk shows for David Letterman and James Corden. Lisa also spent time working on the series *Dancing with the Stars* and *Survivor* and two soaps, *The Young and the Restless* and 16 years with *The Bold and the Beautiful*.

Lisa retired from CBS Television City in December of 2022. She and her husband John live in Del Aire, CA.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD Dan Sweetman Illustrator

Dan Sweetman was born on October 17, 1962, one day after the Cuban Missile Crisis began. He had no clue the world was on the edge of World War III, and if he had the ability to do something about it, he certainly would have. But being a newborn, his options were limited. He was raised in Pasadena, CA, the youngest of seven. Playing sports was the dominant activity in his family, but Dan showed little interest in doing that. Mostly because from a very early age, while watching his older brother and sisters play baseball, he stood too close to the batter and the bat missed the ball and connected with his head. "Mom!...Dan got hit in the head again!" Instead of sports, Dan discovered a deep love for drawing. "I can't remember not ever drawing. not after all those hits to my head," he said. Lucky for him, being the baby of a large family, his parents were tired enough to leave him alone, allowing his innate talent to develop. While in high school. Dan drew for the school newspaper, drawing caricatures of teachers and cartoons for articles and flyers.

In his senior year, he was able to attend Pasadena City College simultaneously, allowing him to begin serious study to develop his talents. After high school, he attended California State University at Long Beach and




graduated with a BFA in Illustration and a girl that was to be his wife in 1988. Right from the start, he began freelance editorial illustration for various newspapers and magazines, including the *Los Angeles Times*, *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *Conde Nast Traveler Magazine* and *Rolling Stone*, among others. At the same time, he illustrated the series *Beautiful Stories for Ugly Children*, published by Piranha Press, an imprint of DC Comics, written by Dave Louapre, a black-andwhite monthly self-contained illustrated short story fables with a dark humor twist. He also illustrated Vertigo Comics' one-shot graphic novel Doctor Occult and the six-issue limited series *The Last One*, written by Mark DeMatteis.


Without the guidance of fellow alumnus from CSULB, David Lowery, Dan would have never considered a path to Hollywood as a storyboard artist. When Dan reached out to David asking, "What is this storyboard thing all about?" David's answer was, "I was waiting for you to call." David thought Dan would be a good fit for storyboarding and guided him into what that world was all about. David championed Dan by recommending him for projects, yet success didn't happen overnight. Getting into the union was the key and that can prove to be difficult. Finally, Dan landed a position as a junior illustrator on a Harold Becker film called *Nightride Down* that had not yet unionized. Senior Illustrator Sherman Labby, who was also working on the project, insisted to producers that Dan get the 30 days of work required that would allow him to join the union. With that roadblock passed, Dan became a member of Local 790, and the game was on. Learning as he went, with the generous help from


fellow members, Dan gained his footing and grew confident in understanding how films are made and how stories can be told. Thirty-two years later, he worked on more than 100 films in all genres, from epic to silly comedy, including two Best Pictures: Braveheart (1996) and Birdman (2015). He has had the pleasure of working with directors such as Mel Gibson (Braveheart, Apocalypto), Peter Weir (*Master and Commander:* The Far Side of the World), Chris Columbus (Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone), George Miller (Contact), Robert Zemeckis (Beowulf), Sam Raimi (Spider-Man 1 and 2), Christopher Nolan (*The Prestige*), Tom Shadyac (Ace Ventura: Pet Detective, The Nutty Professor, Liar Liar), Peter Segal (Anger Management, Get Smart), Brian Helgeland (A Knight's Tale, *Payback*), among many others.

Dan lives with his wife of 36 years, Jamie (the one he brought back from college), in the foothills of Los Angeles and they both share a love of drawing. Jamie teaches anatomy for artist, life drawing, illustration and printmaking at CSULB, USC and APU. In his free time, Dan enjoys sharing his experience with Jamie's students and painting an ongoing series of beach scenes with an emphasis on the figure. He also likes to sketch from life at various locations around the Southland. He still avoids drawing at baseball games. Dan and Jamie have two grown children, Ondy and David.













LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD Barbara Mesney Set designer



A native of New York City. Barbara graduated from the High School of Performing Arts. which put her firmly in the entertainment industry from an early age. Having been stage manager for all the weekly stage productions at Performing Arts. Barbara's love of all things backstage and away from the limelight was cemented. She went on to graduate from San Francisco State University with a degree in scenic design and tech theatre.



Immediately following graduation, Barbara worked as a scenic and mural artist. In partnership, she worked on figurative interior murals in oil colors for the Golden Nugget Las Vegas and Atlantic City, as well as the Hilton Hotel at Disney World. As a Lead Scenic Artist, she worked in various regional venues, including the Oregon Shakespeare Festival in Ashland; the American Conservatory Theatre in San Francisco; The Empty Space, ACT and the Intimate Theaters in Seattle; San Jose Repertory Theatre; Santa Rosa Summer Rep, as well as many other venues. Her work as a theatrical scenic designer developed concurrent to her work as a Scenic Artist and she designed for many regional theaters, including American Conservatory Theatre, San Francisco Opera, Virginia Opera, Western Opera, Berkeley Rep, the Magic Theatre, Eureka Theatre, San Francisco Shakespeare Festival, Berkeley Shakespeare Festival, Santa Cruz Shakespeare Festival, Pickle Family Circus, Marin Theatre Company, San Jose Rep, Tacoma Actors Guild, among many others.


Barbara was the recipient of numerous Dramalogue and Bay Area Theatre Critics Awards for her design work. She served as associate designer for the American


Conservatory Theatre for several years, where, in addition to her own scenic designs, she supervised all drafting and model making for all productions each season. She created the repertory hanging plots for all productions performing in rep and designed by various scenic designers, all in the original Geary Theatre (a rare "hemp house" before its demise in the earthquake of 1989). She was responsible for the supervision and finishing of all sets through to opening night. She knew nothing about filmmaking when she interviewed for the set designer position on the film Class Action, a fully union feature filmed in San Francisco under the local jurisdiction of IATSE Local 16. To her truly great surprise, she was offered the job. She loved being in the Art Department, so for the next five years, she attempted to straddle both live theatre and film. This included stage designs overseas for the Greenwich Theatre in London, England, as well as the televised awards show The Golden Eye Awards in Ostend, Belgium. She continued working on movies filming in San Francisco, including Basic Instinct: So, I Married an Axe Murderer; among others.

She was encouraged by several production designers she worked with to make the move to Los Angeles, which she did in 1992. For the next three years, she worked on numerous "grandfathered" productions with the intent on joining IATSE Local 847, Set Designers and Model Makers. She was happily sworn into the union by Marjo Bernay in 1995. She worked as a Junior Set Designer for the next two years, attaining senior status in 1997. Her feature work includes around 60 features, including

Argo; Hail, Caesar!; Gone Girl; Anchorman; Anchorman 2; Captain America: The Winter Soldier; Ant-Man; Crazy, Stupid, Love; Little Fockers; The Bucket List; Spider-Man 3; Talladega Nights: The Ballad of Ricky Bobby; Lucky You; Christmas with the Kranks; Herbie Fully Loaded; American Wedding; Terminator 3; America's Sweethearts; The Next Best Thing; Stuart Little; The Deep End of the Ocean; Con Air; Courage Under Fire; Matilda; Blown Away; Haunted Mansion; among many others. Her television work includes Bosch; Cinderella (with Whitney Houston); Twin Peaks (Rancho Rosa); Enlightened 2; Glee; The Kominsky Method; Not Dead Yet; Why Women Kill; 9-1-1; This Fool; The Real O'Neals; American Horror Story; Snowpiercer; Grace and Frankie; Criminal Minds; among many others.

In addition to her set design work, Barbara has been painting in oil colors for three decades. She has exhibited her artwork in various venues around Southern California and had the pleasure of participating in many of the art shows for Gallery 800 before the COVID shutdown. Her work includes landscapes, still life, and figurative work, including portraits. She also enjoys painting animals, particularly dogs and barnyard animals. Her volunteer work at/and for Best Friends Animal Society continues to inspire her love of animals, and she hopes to paint many more animals in the future.



HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE CARL JULES WEYL



Carl Jules Weyl (6 December 1890–12 July 1948) was a German–born Art Director who immigrated to the US on 31 March 1912, according to his 1933 petition for citizenship. Weyl studied at the École des Beaux–Arts in Paris after architectural training in Berlin, Strasbourg, and Munich. He served as a first lieutenant of infantry in the German Reichswehr, according to his World War I draft registration card.




Weyl worked as an architect in California, first for John W. Reid Jr. in San Francisco, then in Los Angeles after he moved there in 1923. He established the architectural firm Gogerty & Weyl with Henry L. Gogerty. Together, they designed numerous buildings in Hollywood, including the Palace Theatre (1926), Baine Building (1926), Hollywood Studio Building (1927), Yucca Vine Tower (1929), 6305-09 Yucca Street, Art Deco, Fred C. Thompson Building, 6528-6540 Sunset Boulevard, Spanish Colonial.

Other buildings designed by Weyl include Hollywood Brown Derby (1928), 1628 N. Vine Street Herman Building (1928), 1632 N. Vine Street, Christie Realty Building (1928), 6765 Hollywood Boulevard, York Boulevard State Bank, 5057 York Boulevard, Los Angeles. When the Great Depression hit and building commissions dried up, Weyl joined Cecil B. DeMille Productions as an Art Director, then he joined Warner Bros. in the same position. Weyl initially worked as an assistant to Anton Grot and Robert M. Haas. His first set for Warner Bros. was the fountain in *Footlight Parade*. He won an Oscar in the category Best Art Direction for *The Adventures of Robin Hood*. He was also nominated in the same category for the *Mission to Moscow*.

He designed such landmark Los Angeles buildings as the Hollywood Palace Theatre and the Brown Derby restaurant, prior to landing a career as an Art Director in the early 1930s at Warner Bros. Studios.



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One of his first assignments was designing the sets for *The Case of the Curious Bride* (1935), an early Perry Mason mystery. It was a quick B-production, featuring simple sets such as an apartment, courtroom, diner, and Mason's office, but it gave Weyl a chance to acquaint himself with creating architecture for film. Many more assignments for budget films and quick comedies would follow until 1937, when Weyl designed the sets for two better releases: *Ready, Willing and Able* and *Kid Galahad*. His consistent work at the studio led to Weyl being offered *The Adventures of Robin Hood*, giving him his first chance to experiment with the architecture of a different period. Weyl created several beautiful sets for this classic, including the interior of Nottingham Castle with the now-famous circular stone staircase, and Sherwood Forest. Weyl romanticized this forest, which was filmed in Chico, California, by spray-painting the foliage green and adding a number of artificial rocks and trees.

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




LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD J. Dennis Washington PRODUCTION DESIGNER



Born in Santa Monica, California, Dennis grew up on the west side of Los Angeles, surrounded by family in Culver City, and his mom's side living nearby. His father's side traces all the way back to George Washington—his sixth great–granduncle.

Dennis' dad was a contractor who built custom homes for many of the stars of old Hollywood, and he had the privilege of working alongside his dad through high school. It was there that he developed a deep appreciation for fine craftsmanship and attention to detail.







After grade school, Dennis went on to study architecture in college. Around that time, his friend who worked as a mail boy at 20th Century Studios knew how much he loved drawing and sketching. He suggested Dennis consider working in the film industry, particularly in the Art Department. Having no connection to the industry, Dennis interviewed at the major studios, and that summer of 1965, MGM gave him a call and he was hired right off the street. Dennis started as a Junior Set Designer, and from the very beginning, he knew he was exactly where he was meant to be.

Working in large Art Departments gave Dennis the invaluable opportunity to learn from seasoned professionals, where he learned various styles, proportions, and designing for film. Over the years, he worked his way up through a variety of studios and pictures, but not without help. Colleagues like Richard Lawrence (who got Dennis his Assistant Art Director's card on *The Exorcist II*), Ferdy Carrere, (who helped him get an Art Director's card on *Convoy*, with Sam Peckinpah), and Tom Shaw (who offered him his first production design job on *Victory*, with John Huston) were instrumental in the journey. In fact, Dennis went on to make three films with John Huston—experiences that propelled his career to new heights.

As time passed, Dennis worked on a variety of films as a Production Designer, and directed second unit on three projects. Some of his favorite projects were *Stand by Me, The Fugitive,* and *Thirteen Days,* which offered unforgettable experiences confronting gratifying challenges, working with talented people and traveling to new locations. Through it all, Dennis has







been supported by an incredible family, dear friends, and a strong community of colleagues. He feels so grateful to have spent 56 years in the film industry, with the union providing a solid framework for his career. And the fun isn't over yet!

J. DENNIS WASHINGTON LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

With a career spanning over 50 years, Dennis has designed some of the most beloved films in cinema history, including Stand by Me, The Fugitive, Dante's Peak, White Men Can't Jump, Nebraska, and 13 Days. He also collaborated with legendary director John Huston on three films, showcasing his exceptional ability to craft immersive, visually stunning worlds. Born in Santa Monica, California, Dennis initially pursued architecture before discovering his true calling in the art department at MGM, where he began as a junior set designer in 1965. Since then, his dedication to excellence has made him a cornerstone of the industry. Dennis's legacy as a master of production design continues to inspire generations of filmmakers and artists alike, leaving an indelible mark on the world of visual storytelling.

CARLJULES WEYL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

Born in Stuttgart, Germany, Weyl's early architectural training in Berlin, Strasbourg, and Munich, followed by studies at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris, laid a solid foundation for his illustrious career. After immigrating to the United States in 1912, he established himself as a prominent architect in California, designing notable structures such as the Hollywood Brown Derby and contributing to the Hollywood Boulevard Commercial and Entertainment District. Transitioning to film during the Great Depression, Weyl joined Warner Brothers as an art director, where his designs for Casablanca, The Big Sleep, and The Adventures of Robin Hood-for which he won a Best Art Direction Oscar-remain timeless examples of cinematic artistry. As we honor his legacy, we are reminded of the foundational work that continues to inspire our craft today.



JASON REITMAN CINEMATIC IMAGERY AWARD

With films like Juno and Up in the Air, Reitman has demonstrated the profound synergy between director and art department, creating worlds that are as visually compelling as they are emotionally resonant. His directorial debut, Thank You for Smoking (2005), showcased his knack for sharp satire and visual storytelling. Reitman continued to explore complex narratives with Young Adult (2011) and Tully (2018), further cementing his reputation for crafting visually engaging and thought-provoking films. In 2021, he directed Ghostbusters: Afterlife, a continuation of the original series his father, Ivan Reitman, made famous. His latest project, Saturday Night (2024), offers a behind-the-scenes look at the inaugural episode of Saturday Night Live, capturing the chaotic energy and creativity of live television. Reitman's diverse body of work underscores his commitment to visual storytelling, making him a deserving honoree of the Cinematic Imagery Award.



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
