LOS ANGELES, March 10, 2017 – The Art Directors Guild (IATSE Local 800) Gallery 800 announces its *Drawing Down the Moon* show featuring the art of Seymour Klate (1919 –1992) and 31 artists. The ADG is hosting the opening reception, free to the public, in the heart of the NoHo Arts District on **Saturday, March 18, 2017** from 5:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m, with live music by the Do Drop In jazz trio. The exhibit will run through June 3, 2017.

In addition to being a former President of the ADG and a governor of the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, Seymour Klate was a prominent television and movie Production Designer and Art Director best known for shows like *Somewhere in Time, The Manchurian Candidate, North by Northwest, Cleopatra, Catch 22, The Buster Keaton Show, The Rosemary Clooney Show* and *Walter Winchell News.* This is the first exhibition of his work since his death 25 years ago.
