I was particularly excited about building these two young men's bedrooms, as to me, their worlds grow from there.


One had old English colours - greens, golds and burgundy whereas the other one had bold, sophisticated blues and oranges with a touch of bright yellow.



With sets including a national political campaign with logos and slogans to design, a Buckingham Palace reception and White House offices, we had to be very precise with our replicas while also building our own story, own artwork flair and details.

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People still ask me where we shot in the US. Guess what? We didn't! The film was shot entirely in London and its surroundings, but we put extra effort into finding our US locations. Our objective was not to break our audience's suspension of disbelief, so we had to do it right. With a smart mix of great locations, big and small builds, and well-planned green screen extensions, we recreated our own America in London.

I had the great pleasure of collaborating with the talented Neil Floyd (Set Decorator) and Heather Noble (Art Director). I felt incredibly supported and inspired by them, making this project very special. Together with the rest of our crew, I felt like I was playing with Dream Team!

I am very proud of the impact of this project, its large international audience and all the messages of appreciation from people who loved the movie. We got so many emails from fans wanting to get hold of our original artwork or even furniture pieces we design and upholster ourselves! I feel that all our passion, attention to detail and craftsmanship really paid off.
