

THE ROSES are Ivy & Theo, a couple navigating a major rupture in their relationship after 15 years of marriage.

The black comedy (a re-imagining of the 1989 War of the Roses) was scripted by Tony McNamara and directed by Jay Roach for Searchlight Pictures. The budget was 30m USD. Whereas the update moved the Roses - an English couple - to Northern California, filming occurred in London and surrounds, coastal Devon and Pinewood Studios. While leaning into a slightly heightened, off-kilter and spirited mis-en-scene for the cautionary yet comedic tale, this twist in story and location obviously affected the process and choices in designing the film.

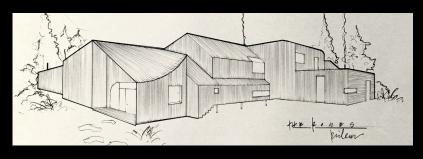
As an unexpected storm initiates a surprise culinary success for chef lvy Rose at her homespun CRAB SHACK - architect Theo Roses' sleek new MARITIME MUSEUM simultaneously collapses in spectacular form and failure. The duel split of these events begins the split of the couple themselves - so each set led to visually and symbolically represent the disparate character and personality of each player.

The Crab Shack, a location in South Devon and Kitchen studio build transformed 3 times; from "For Sale" dilapidated seafood restaurant to lvy's charming new part time Bistro WE'VE GOT CRABS, and finally, with her success, to the corporatized and rebranded version - GOT CRABS.

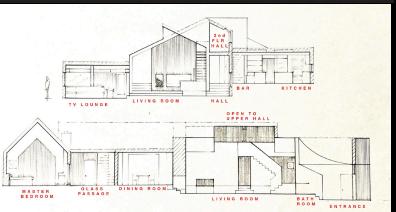
Theo's Museum was initially scripted as the opening of his architectural addition to an existing Library in the center of an American town. Location limitations drove a rethink, and opened up the concept of a museum complex. A giant sculptural, wind catching SAIL also helped explain how the structure could conceivably fail in a strong storm. Thus a coastal maritime theme was hatched. The entire design was worked up in the Art Dept, finalized as a digital construction (and destruction) and married to a corresponding shooting location dressed as the Museum Cafe & Gift Shop. Theo, and everyone else, witnesses his downfall compliments of blue screen.

The third main set in the film is the HOUSE that Theo designs in an attempt to regain his mojo and bring the couple back together. Ultimately this House wanted to be such that two people would feel compelled to kill each other over it. Built entirely at Pinewood, the House was conceived as a sophisticated yet playful take on a modern "Scandi" design. Organic tones and textures tie it to the coastal cliff environment - however the guiding Danish concept of Hygge (warm/cozy/inviting) eventually falters with the very UN welcoming the Roses elicit on their guests, and each other. Staircases are meant to be sculpturally beautiful, yet cantelevered and dangerous. Walls are fractured and punctured from inception, and the sharp angles and beams in the rafters become menacingly shadowy when the lights are shot out. (The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari came to mind).

An enormous picture window in the primary bedroom is already teetering over .. as the entire house teeters on the cliff's edge. And finally even the homey wood burning fireplaces and Ivy's beloved Julie Child stove (which Theo is forced to include ...) can't help but bring the Roses - and THE ROSES - to an end.

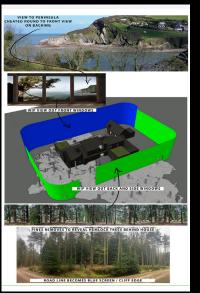


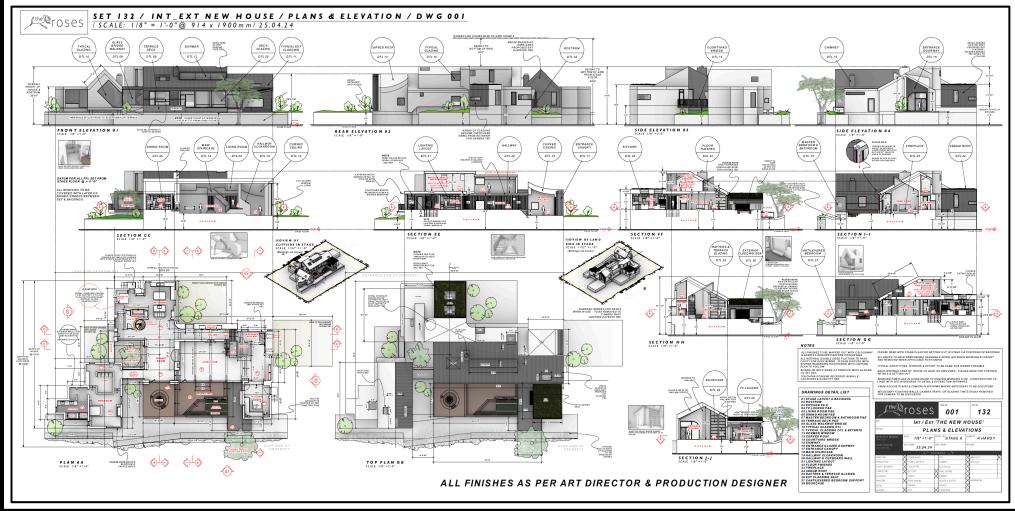












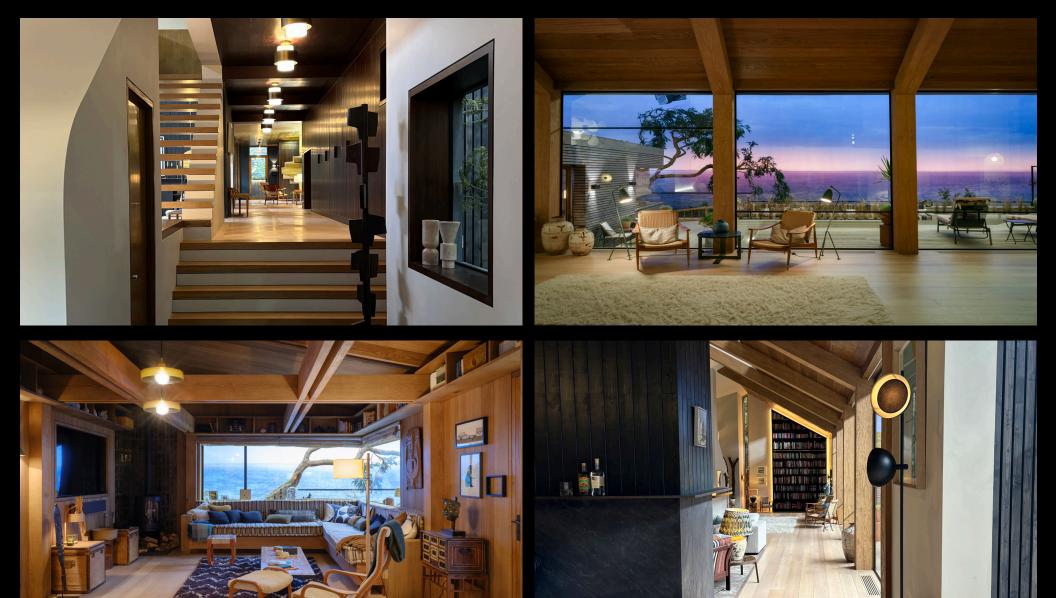


























































































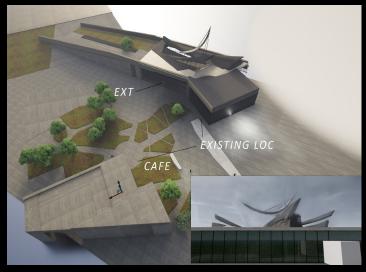








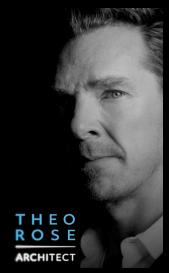






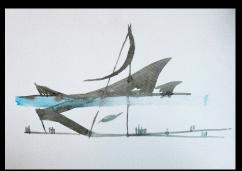


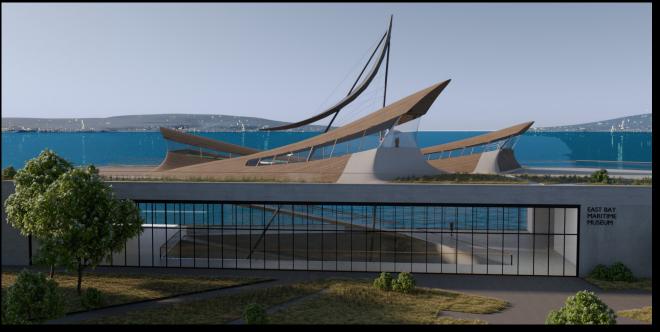
