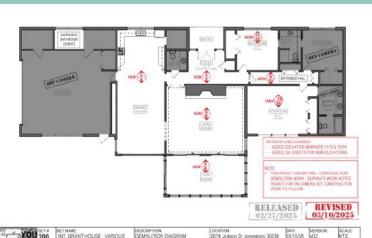

on-location work

For "Regretting You", our on-location work here was both challenging and rewarding. We essentially stripped the interior of the of this existing house down to its bare bones, replacing every door, piece of trip, and adding wood paneling to capture the mid-century modern vibe. We painted all the walls, installed faux flooring over existing surfaces to recreate the house's potential from its original era.

One of the most significant challenges was completely gutting the original 1972 kitchen and redesigning it three times (abatement and remediation was unavoidable, of course) to fit the three distinct looks of the house throughout our story. Despite the complexities of building an entire practical kitchen in on-location three times (my experience and common sense to build this interior bumped up against budget constraints, so) we embraced the reality of working on location, bringing authenticity and depth to the film's setting.









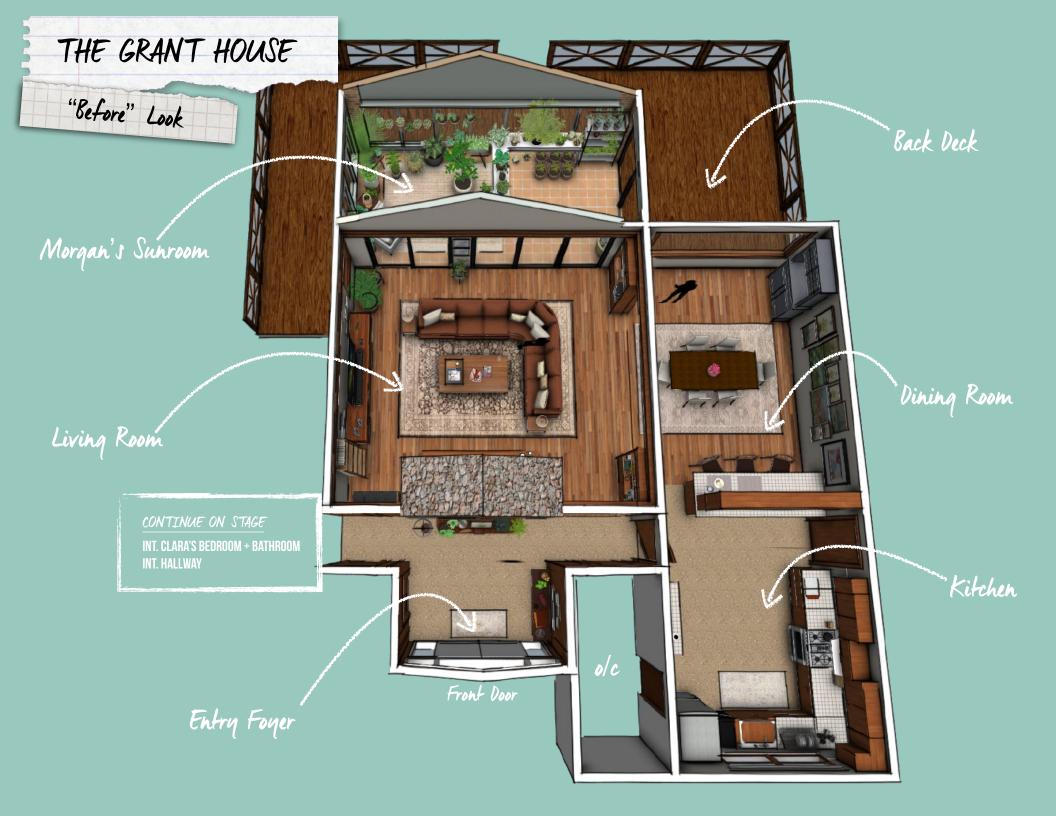
3YOU 200 INT GRANT HOUSE - VARIOUS DEMOLITION DIAGRAM



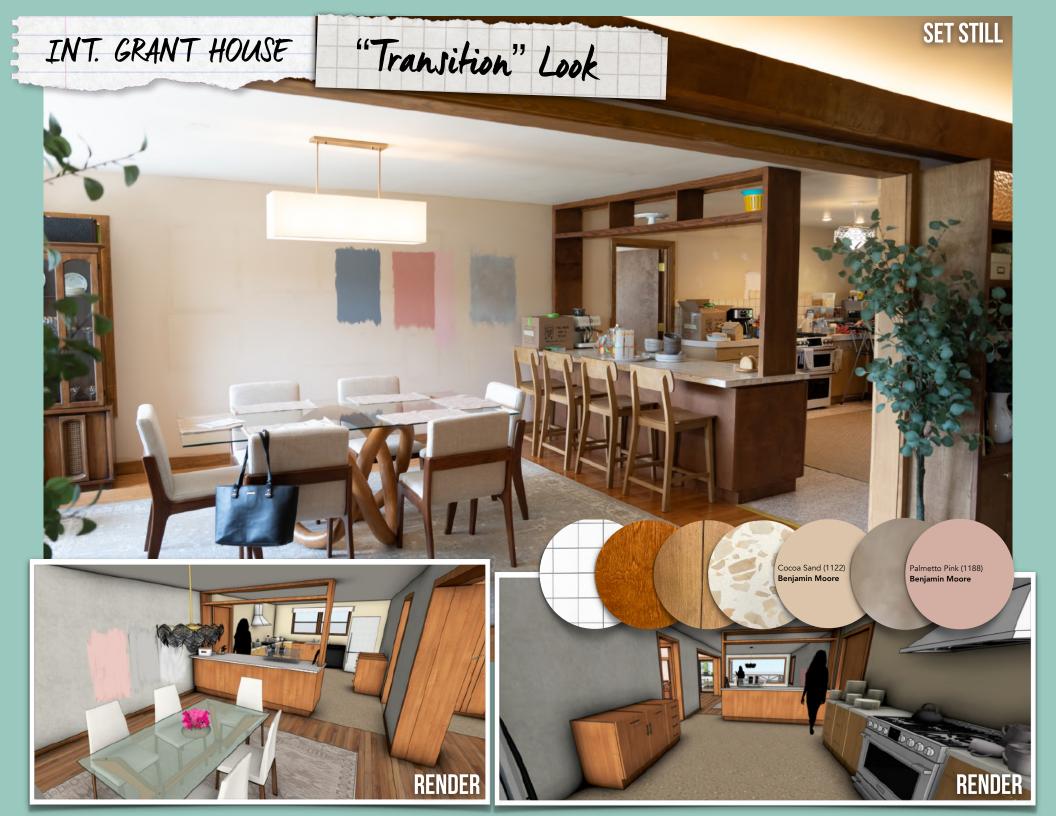






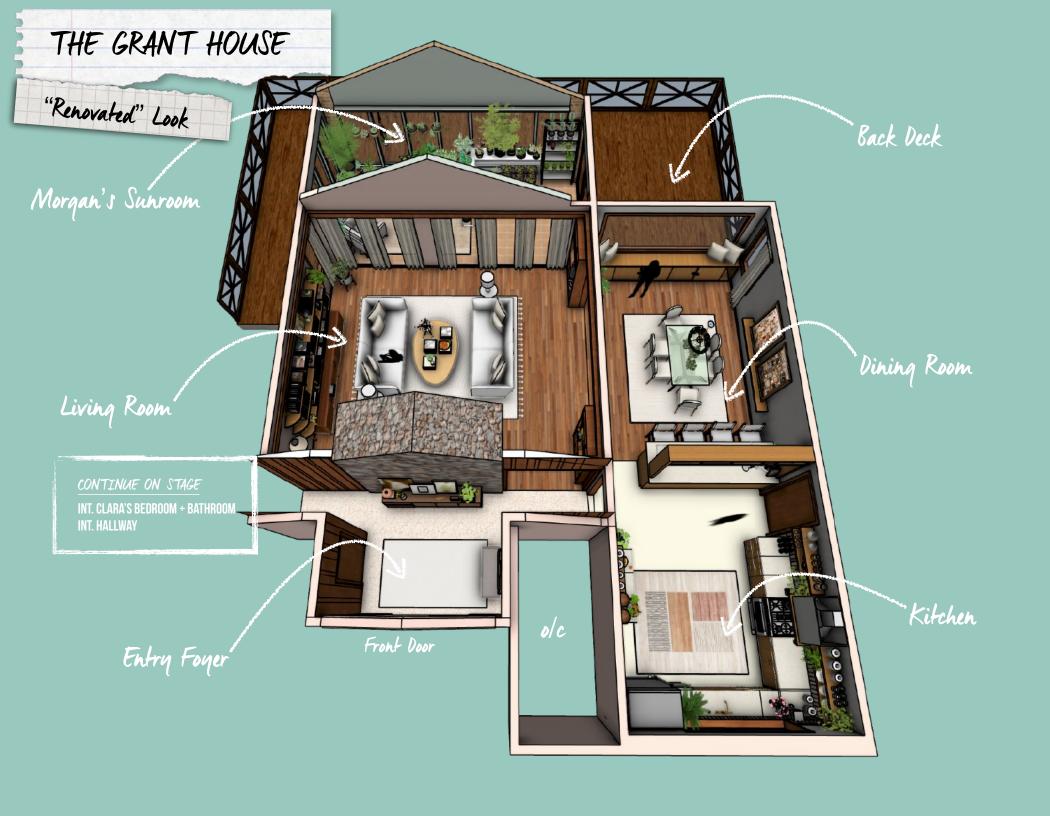












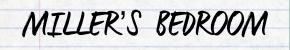
CLARA'S BEDROOM

Clara's Bedroom and Bathroom was a fully built stage set, designed that way for logistical flexibility and weather cover. I wanted this space to feel cohesive with the Grant House — rooted in the traditional character of a 1970s ranch-style home. We kept the room largely "untouched" in terms of renovations, leaning into period elements like original-style carpeting and warm wood paneling.









Miller's Bedroom was on-location, in an 108-year old farm house in North Georgia. Logistically this was a challenge due to weight restrictions on this delicate location as well as prepping and shooting upstairs in an existing space. We painted and wallpapered the room to shift it into an early 2000's vibe (as if, this inherited room had been Miller's dad's room when he was in high school.
